

# Mounting Remote Directories With SSHFS On Ubuntu 11.10

This tutorial explains how you can [mount a directory from a remote server on the local server securely using SSHFS](#) [3]. SSHFS (Secure SHell FileSystem) is a filesystem that serves files/directories securely over SSH, and local users can use them just as if they were local files/directories. On the local computer, the remote share is mounted via FUSE (Filesystem in Userspace). I will use Ubuntu 11.10 for both the local and the remote server.
